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The Academies at Roxborough High School develop strong college and career competencies that empower students to contribute to our global society.



As you prepare to embark on this adventure, we would like to share some advice for the next few months before you officially begin your high school experience.

1. Welcome! Roxborough High School is an Academy High School. Each 9th grade student and a guardian/parenting adult are expected to attend the mandatory 9th grade orientation on Thursday, August 22nd, 2024 from 9:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. The first day of classes will be held on Monday August 26th, 2024. Students and families will learn about various aspects of the school, including academics, climate

expectations, and all of the wonderful offerings at our school.



2. **Be prepared:** High school will challenge you in ways that you might not otherwise expect. One of the best ways to be ready for these challenges is to mentally prepare yourself. Begin setting goals. What sorts of grades would you like to earn? How do you study? What is your system of organization? Where do you need to improve? What are you really good at? Answering these questions will help you begin the process of being ready to be your best self when you come to the Academies at Roxborough.
